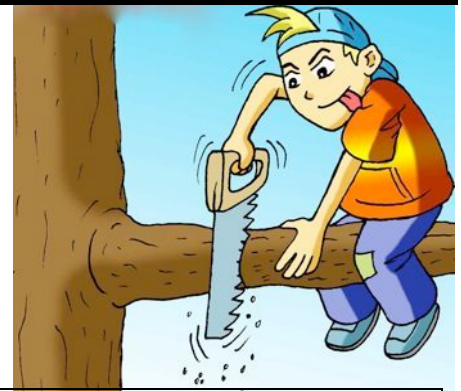


Even More Proverbs
