be	be (short form)	have	have (short form)	can
I am not	... <i>I'm not</i>	I have not	... <i>I haven't</i>	I can't (cannot)
you are not	... <i>you aren't</i>	you have not	you can't
he is not	he has not	he can't
she is not	she has not	... <i>she hasn't</i>	she can't
it is not	it has not	it can't
we are not	we have not	we can't
you are not	you have not	you can't
they are not	they have not	they can't
