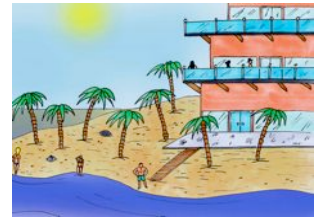


They are on the plane back to London. They are looking forward to their home in Ashford, Kent. Fourteen-year-old Susie is sitting between her mother and her
