Open questions are introduced with a question word (and the answer then consists of a sentence or partial sentence): WHERE do you live? In Spain.

When do you come? What time?
Where does she live? What place?
What do you do in the evening? What action?
Who(m) does he visit? What person?
Why is he late? What reason?
How can you listen to that music? What kind?

After **WHO:** Don't use DO (because, who "is the noun):

Who comes every day? Which person?
